



## AmeriCorps Community Health Educator Member Description Full Time/Part-Time

Position Title: Community Health Educator  
 Worksite: Nenahnezad Chapter.  
 Work Days: Monday – Friday (Possibly weekends).  
 Work Hours: 8:00am – 5:00pm

Term of Service: The AmeriCorps members term of service will be approximately 40 weeks in which hours of service must be completed to be eligible for an educational award up to the amount of \$5,730 for full-time (completing 1700 hours of service), \$2,865 for part-time (completing 900 hours of service), \$1515.55 for quarter-time (completing 450 hours of service), and \$1212.44 (completing 300 hours of service) for minimum time. A service week generally spans Monday through Friday and a standard service day is 8 hours long for full-time and 4 hours long for part-time, quarter-time and minimum time. There will be evening and weekend service opportunities. During their year of service, members will receive a total \$13,700 living stipend for full-time, \$3,500 living stipend for part-time, \$1750 living allowance for quarter-time, and \$1,000 living allowance for minimum time. Living allowances will be paid bi-weekly.

Position Start Date/End Date: Anticipate October 2015 start date and the end date shall not extend beyond August 31, 2016.

Position Description: An AmeriCorps member is an individual who is serving in an approved national service position and is eligible to receive an educational award from the National Service Trust. The Community Health Educator will help meet the nutrition, fitness and educational needs of youth and

families by distributing food supplies, facilitating personal wellness class, hosting nutrition and physical fitness classes, promoting physical exercise and activity through the renovation of a walking and bike path, and serving as a role model for Navajo youth in the northeastern Arizona region and northwestern New Mexico corridor of the Navajo Nation. Members will provide knowledge and awareness on available tools and resources to address food insecurity issues in the native food desert and reach youth to engage in increased physical activity for improved health outcomes and a reduction in risk for childhood obesity.

Education Requirements: The member certifies that he/she is a high school graduate or has received his/her diploma or G.E.D. Youth 16 years and older who are still in high school must certify that they will not drop out of high school to participate in AmeriCorps and commit to completing a high school degree.

Experience Requirements: The member must be a United States citizen, a national or legal permanent resident and at least 16 years of age. The member must receive a favorable background check through the NSOPW, NM Criminal History Registry, state of residence Criminal History Registry, to include a FDLE / FBI check based on fingerprinting. Members must have reliable transportation. Strong desire to serve and a desire to work with youth. Demonstrate mutual respect for diverse population and the ability to relate to people from diverse backgrounds. Excellent in communication and organization skills.
